### **COMPASS Test**

The COMPASS is a computerized and adaptive test which determines a student's competency level in reading, writing and mathematics. It is used as a placement tool at all of the community colleges in the state as well as many schools on the mainland. Waiakea High School has developed a project with the Hawaii Community College Learning Center whereby students may be tested on the WHS campus as opposed to the usual procedure of making an appointment at the college and taking the test at the HawCC Center. An additional benefit of this agreement is that not only grade 12 students are eligible but the school is also able to test students in grade 11. The results of the test indicate the classes and programs the WHS students qualify for at college. Appropriate follow up counseling and guidance is also administered by WHS COMPASS counselors. For further information or to sign up to take the COMPASS Test students can stop by C102 at any time during the school day from 8:00am to 1:00pm. Parents may also call the school at ext. 248. There is NO COST to the students to take the test. There IS a cost to re-test.

### **Running Start**

Running Start at Hawai'i Community College (HawCC) is a program designed to provide academic opportunities for qualified high school juniors and seniors. Students are able to enroll at HawCC and earn both college and high school credits. Interested students must take the COMPASS placement tests in reading, writing and and math and meet the pre-requisite levels for the course. The UH System Application Form and Running Start Enrollment Form must be completed with the student's grade level counselor. College tuition and fees apply. Interested students can begin testing in the spring semester of their sophomore year of high school and should see their counselor for more information.

Dear Parents / Guardians,

As a part of Waiakea High School's effort to assist our students, we are implementing the State of Hawai'i's Common Core Algebra HI performance standards by ensuring students are prepared with 21<sup>st</sup> century college and career readiness skills. Waiakea High School's primary goal is for graduates to enter post secondary options without the need for remediation.

Algebra 1 is the foundation of high school math. In order to ensure students have a strong foundation for future math courses, a "no D policy" is being implemented in Algebra 1. Students will need to earn a 70% overall grade to earn credit for Algebra 1. This policy allows students to retake any assessment once, which may increase their overall score. In addition, the State DOE athletic grade check policy will be followed.

### Students will experience:

- Hawai'i State Common Core Curriculum
- Performance Based Grading System students' grades [A, B, C or F] are primarily based on the percentage earned on tests and quizzes.
- Opportunities to relearn material and retake an assessment once
- State End of Course Exam (EOC), a comprehensive assessment on Algebra 1 concepts and skills. It is worth 15% of the overall year grade.
- Student Support Services:
  - P8 math tutoring: 7:00am 3:30pm daily
  - Q104 resource room tutoring: 7:30am 3:30pm daily
  - Assessment retakes can be done during *closing* with student's math teacher

In order for your child to be successful, cooperation between students, parents and teachers is essential. Students need to be responsible and accountable for their own learning, which means they may have to give up their personal time. The teachers at Waiakea High School are committed to helping your child succeed and we need your support.

Dear Faculty, Staff, and Parents/Guardians:

In 1986, Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) which mandated the Asbestos-Containing Materials in Schools Rule, 40 CFR Part 763. It requires all primary and secondary school buildings to be inspected by AHERA accredited inspectors and to identify all asbestos-containing building materials. The rule further requires the development of a management plan by an AHERA accredited management planner that is based on the findings of the inspection. The management plan outlines our intent in controlling the potential for exposure to asbestos fibers in our school.

In February 2001, Hawaii Administrative Rules Chapter 11-502 was adopted by the Hawaii State Legislature. These rules essentially mirror the requirements of the AHERA regulations. In both cases, the rule requires our school to notify parents, teachers, and employees of the presence and status of asbestos containing material in our school buildings.

The initial inspection of our school was conducted in 1988 and identifies some asbestos-containing materials. Since that time, we continue to conduct periodic surveillances and re-inspections to ensure that the asbestos-containing materials remain in good condition and do not pose a hazard to our students and staff.

An asbestos management plan was drafted based on our initial inspection and submitted to the Hawaii State Department of Health. It outlines in detail the methods we will use to maintain the material in a safe manner. The management plan is updated regularly as asbestos is removed or conditions change.

A copy of the management plan is on file in the administrative office and is available for your review during our regular school hours.
