 - Math (Algebra 1, Algebra 1 Honors or Geometry Honors)
 - Science (Physical Science or Biology Honors)
 - Transition to High School / Physical Education Lifetime Fitness
 - Elective 1
 - Elective 2

 - Physical Education Lifetime Activities / Health Today & Tomorrow
 - Elective 1 (Academy Pathway Elective)
 - Elective 2

 - English (English 11, English 11 Honors or AP English Language, English 11 for English Learners is also available)
 - Social Studies (Modern History of Hawai'i/Participation in Democracy or AP US Government)
 - Math (Algebra 2, Algebra 2 Honors, Trigonometry Honors/Precalculus Honors)
 - Science (Chemistry, Chemistry Honors, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, Integrated Science, Science for Self & Society)
 - Elective 1(Academy Pathway Elective)
 Elective 2
 - Elective 3

Process (Class of 2026)

- All class of 2026 students will have the following classes:
 - English (English 12, English 12 Honors or AP English Literature, English 12 for English Learners is also available)
 - Social Studies (Academy Senior Social Studies Course Catalog, pages 19 50)
 - Math* (Optional a 4th math credit is highly recommended if pursuing a STEM career)
 - Science* (Optional a 4th science credit is highly recommended if pursuing a STEM career)
 - Academy Pathway Work-Based Learning
 - Elective 1 (Academy Pathway Elective)
 - Elective 2

*If not taking a 4th math and/or science course, additional electives should be taken

- The order in which courses are listed matter

- Schedule changes are not usually possible
- Most Honors & Advanced Placement courses will have summer assignments
- Consider a balanced schedule
- English Lab and Math Workshop classes
 - Excellent for students why may need extra supports to pass their regular English and/or Math classes AND want to take the class
 - If students are willing and able to seek assistance from Teachers and/or Tutors (Q104) during non-class time (before school, after school, recess, lunch), these support classes might not be needed

- Students attending WIS or WHS and living in district
 - o Student enrollment is automatically granted at Waiakea High School for next school year
 - You do not need to anything other than completing and submitting the Course Request Form
- Students attending WHS on a Geographic Exception (GE)
 - Student enrollment is automatically granted at Waiakea High School for next school year
 - You do not need to anything other than completing and submitting the Course Request Form
- Students attending WIS on a <u>Geographic Exception (GE)</u>
 - The WIS Registrar or Office Personnel will provide you with a GE Request Form
 - Complete Section I and return it to the WIS Registrar or Office Personnel for Mrs. Souza's acknowledgement
 - WIS will forward the GE Request to WHS for Principal Koga's decision
 - Principal Koga reviews all GE Requests in March. Decisions will be mailed home on or around March 13

Please remember that a condition of the GE is that your student can arrive at school on time regularly!

- Students who are attending Public/Charter schools other than WHS and WIS
 - Living within the Waiakea High School district
 - School Site Locator (Click to see school district lines and/or which school district a residential address is within - ALWAYS contact the school to verify that the address is within their district as the site is not always up to date.)
 - Make an appointment to enroll the student. Use the information on this site to guide you: https://www.waiakeahigh.k12.hi.us/registration
 - Course requests will be entered as soon as Enrollment is complete
 - Living outside of the Waiakea High School district
 - School Site Locator (Click to see school district lines and/or which school district a residential address is within - ALWAYS contact the school to verify that the address is within their district as the site is not always up to date.)
 - You need to apply for a <u>Geographic Exception (GE)</u>
 - You can complete and submit a Course Request form by the deadlines
 - The Registrar will file the Course Request Form until a decision on the GE is made
 - GE Requests need to be signed by the Principal of the student's current school
 - GE Requests should be submitted to the WHS Registrar's Office (with a self addressed stamped envelope) no later than February 28 for priority decision
 - Principal Koga reviews all GE Requests in March. Decisions will be mailed home on or around March 8

November 28 onward

- The Course Registration Forms can continue to be turned in as late submissions
- Scheduling priority will be given to students who have submitted complete Course Registration Forms by the November 27 deadline
- Forms submitted after November 27 will be given consideration as spaces become available. Forms submitted earlier will have a higher scheduling priority
- Students who do not submit forms by December 13 will have their courses selected for them
